Certificates of Veterinary Inspection

1. All out-of-state swine must be accompanied by an official health certificate issued July 31, 2022, or after, signed by the veterinarian in charge of the consignor's operation. Certificate must show name and address of consignor to National Hereford and Tamworth Show.
2. All swine sold at a breed sale should have a CVI issued within 30 days prior to the sale to facilitate interstate movement after the sale.
3. For animals that originate outside the state of Indiana, the exhibitor must have a properly completed official certificate of veterinary inspection (or health papers).
4. Health papers on any animal coming from outside Indiana for exhibition in Indiana are valid for 30 days from the date issued by a veterinarian.
5. CVIs accompanying animals for exhibition must be completed by a licensed and accredited veterinarian. CVIs must clearly include a description of each animal including the age, sex and breed of the animal, and the official, individual identification.
6. Out-of-state swine must have a pre-entry permit number noted on the certificate of CVI. Permits are available online at: <https://www.in.gov/boah/contact-boah/online-import-permit-request/>

Testing

1. Swine from Indiana do not need a brucellosis test. Swine from outside the state do not need a brucellosis test as long as the state of origin is classified brucellosis free by USDA. A certificate of inspection is still required.
2. Swine from Indiana do not need a pseudorabies test. Swine from outside the state do not need a pseudorabies test as long as the state of origin is classified pseudorabies free by USDA. A certificate of inspection is still required.

Required Information

1. Premise Identification Number

2. Official 15-digit 840 ear tag
3. The following statements must be printed on all health papers.
 - No raw garbage fed.
 - No PRV in herd in past 12 months.
 - No PRV vaccine used.
 - Herd is not under quarantine.
 - Hogs have not been exposed to hog cholera.
 - Hog or herd of origin have not had any signs of or diagnosis of TGE or PEDV in the last 60 days.
 - Hog or herd of origin has not been diagnosed with, or been within 10 miles of, vesicular stomatitis within the last 30 days.
 - Hog or farm has not been clinically diagnosed with Seneca Valley virus or have foot or nose lesions within the past 60 days.
